

Intellectual Property Law General Course Guide

Intellectual Property law encourages and protects creators and owners of inventions, art, brands, and other creations of the mind, often generally referred to as “intellectual property.” There are several types of intellectual property including copyright, trademarks, patents, trade secrets, and the right of publicity.
